Variable Notes

- 1 Please refer to the Wave 3 codebook (www.cpc.unc.edu/projects/addhealth/codebooks/wave3) for a detailed list of occupation categories and codes, beginning on page 36 of Section 8.
- 2 If the Respondent reports currently working more than one job for pay, these questions are preceded by the following: "The next questions refer to your main job - that is, the job where you work the most hours."
- 3 These questions are asked of each pregnancy in each relationship reported by the respondent. The relationship number is identified by the variable "RRELNO" (range 1-48), and the relationship pregnancy number is identified by the variable "RPREGNO" (range 1-8).
- 4 These questions were asked about the respondent's children at the end of Section 25 (Children & Parenting). Due to the file structure they are included here at the end of Section 29 (Mistreatment by Adults).
- 5 Valid cases are provided for sub-questions with responses of 0 Not marked / 1 Marked.
- 6 Response categories differ in codebooks for public data and restricted data. Frequencies are provided based on response categories for the restricted data.
