## *Notes on Data*

### 1 Study Description

This study focused on household living arrangements of parents and adult children during times of financial instability. A survey of over 3,000 adults aged 18 years and older from the general population was conducted by Knowledge Networks on behalf of the National Center for Family & Marriage Research. The survey was completed by 3,132 respondents out of 4,478 cases (69.9 % response rate).
