

- 1 Documentation:** For those variables directly asked of respondents *and* found in the data dictionary, the key concept label is used to identify their documentation location; otherwise, the questionnaire section name is given.
  - 2** There are six individuals coded as "0" in the data file. However, the data dictionary does not provide a response label for the value of "0" thus not indicating the type of household these six individuals are residing in.
  - 3** This represents family level information placed on the record of each person in the same family.
  - 4** This represents sub-family level information placed on the record of each person in the same sub-family.
  - 5** Fixes are done with questions FIXNAME and FIXRELRP. Respondents are then asked if any more changes are needed for [NAME]. The need for additional changes is captured with the variable CHG\_MORE.
  - 6** Foster child is not a response category in the data dictionary but it is an option in the questionnaire.
  - 7** This is an unedited variable: it is an unedited field and the universe is not exact.
