

#### 1 Study Description

The data were collected from 752 married and 323 cohabiting couples ages 18 to 64 through a web-based survey conducted by Knowledge Networks between 07/26/2010 and 10/13/2010. The data contain information on union history, work and family stress, marital disillusionment, and health care preferences from both members of the couple. The couple-level data allow researchers to understand couple relations and examine the intra-couple reliability when the reports of members of the couple are compared and contrasted.
