Introduction

- Partnerships have become more diverse among older adults in recent decades.
- Most older singles are categorized as unpartnered but they may go out on dates or be in LAT relationships.
- LAT relationships are acceptable in European countries. Research about LAT relationships in the U.S. is limited.

LAT Relationships

✓ LAT is characteristically defined as a chosen, intimate relationship between partners who are committed to each other for the long term and who live in separate homes.

Debate: LAT relationships are ...

- A stepping stone to cohabitation and marriage. → Features are similar to dating relationships.
- LAT relationships are a new family form. → An alternative to cohabitation and marriage.

Current Study

- Compare LAT relationships with single, dating,
- Distinguish the differences among daters, LATs and cohabitors.

Method

- Wisconsin Longitudinal Study (WLS), 2011
- Analytic sample was 9,665 respondents who were aged 50 and older.
- Analytic strategy:
 - Examine demographic characteristics by relationship type.
 - Examine what factors are related to being a dater, LAT, and cohabitor by using multinomial logistic regression.

Measuring LAT relationships

"Do you go out on dates?"

→ YES: "Do you regularly date one person that you consider your steady partner?" → YES: LATs. NO: Daters.

Descriptive Results

- ✓ Nearly 3% of older adults aged 50 and older are in LAT relationships.
- ✓ Among unmarried partnered older adults, they are more often in LAT relationships (39%) than either dating relationships (31%) or cohabitation (30%).

Descriptive Results Cont.


- ✓ LATs more often have experience of widowhood than daters and cohabitors.
- ✓ Cohabitors less often have resident children than LATs.


Multivariate Results


- ✓ Older adults who are divorced or widowed tend to be in LAT relationships rather than dating relationships or cohabitation.
- Unmarried partnered older adults who have resident children are less likely to be cohabitors than LATs.

- cohabitation, remarriage, and first marriage.

Conclusions

- LAT relationships are distinct from dating and cohabitation.
 - LAT relationships have unique meanings for older adults.
- Future research may examine expectations of cohabitation and marriage among LATs.
