

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# Background

- Types of Cohabitation
- Single Instance Cohabitation
- Serial Cohabitation: two or more cohabiting relationships
- 40% increase over the 90's and early 2000's

## **Context of Cohabitation**

- Lichter, Turner, and Sassler (2010: 759)- "new pattern of intensive co-residential dating among single women."
- Schoen, Landale, and Daniels (2007:817)
   -cohabitation "is an alternative to being single"

# **Prior Research**


- Sex in Adolescence
- More likely to cohabit
- Casual sexual relationships
  - higher odds of cohabitation in early adulthood
    - Unlikely to transition into marriage
- Low GPA, higher delinquency, and low parent closeness are associated with higher odds of cohabitation
- Religiosity is negatively associated with cohabitation

# **Current Study**

- Links adolescent indicators to serial cohabitation
- Utilizes a contemporary cohort of young adults
- Includes men


## Data and Methods

- National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent Health (Add Health, Wave 1 and 4)
- Analytic Sample: n= 6,037
- Wave 1: 16-18 years old
- Wave 4: Respondents were re-interviewed
  - Valid information for union start dates
- Multinomial Logistic Regression







# Measures

- Dependent Variable:
- Premarital Cohabitation-
- Never cohabited
- Cohabited only 1 time
- Cohabited 2 or more times
- Adolescent Indicators:
- Romantic and nonromantic sexual relationships
- Only nonromantic sexual relationships
- No sexual relationships
- Delinquency, parent closeness, importance of religion, and GPA

# **Key Findings**

- Adolescent indicators are related to serial cohabitation:
- Sexual activity is related to serial cohabitation
- Casual sex was not significantly related
- Lower self- esteem and higher delinquency increase odds of serial cohabitation
- Religious importance decreases the odds serial cohabitation

### **Conclusion & Limitations**

- We find that adolescent sexual experiences in general influence the likelihood of cohabiting more than one time
- Other adolescent experiences, like delinquency, positively influence entrance into serial cohabitation
- A limitation may be potential bias with retrospective reports of cohabitation
