Getting Started





 Start with a clean, well-ventilated cage and remove the lid. Here, we used a plastic critter keeper because it is well ventilated and retains humidity when sprayed with water.





 Add a layer or two of absorbent material. We used two-ply paper towels cut to size. Be careful with loose, naturalistic substrates like cocoa fiber as your hatchling may accidently ingest it.





 Add a water bowl filled with clean water and food dishes.





 Add some foliage such as silk plants for hiding and climbing. This provides the gecko with enrichment while also helping them feel secure and safe.





 Now, simply place your hatchling into the enclosure and close the lid. Your enclosure is now a gecko home.
