

# Rhacodactylus Gecko Hatchling Enclosure Set-up

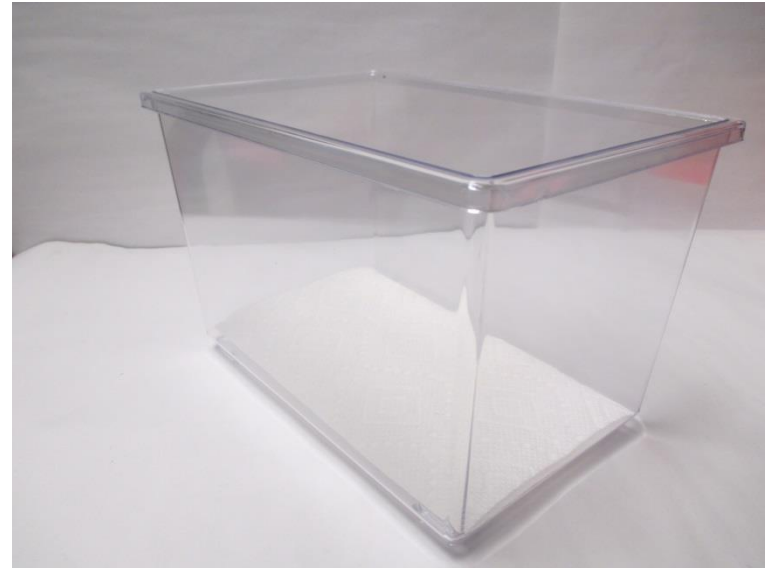

# Getting Started



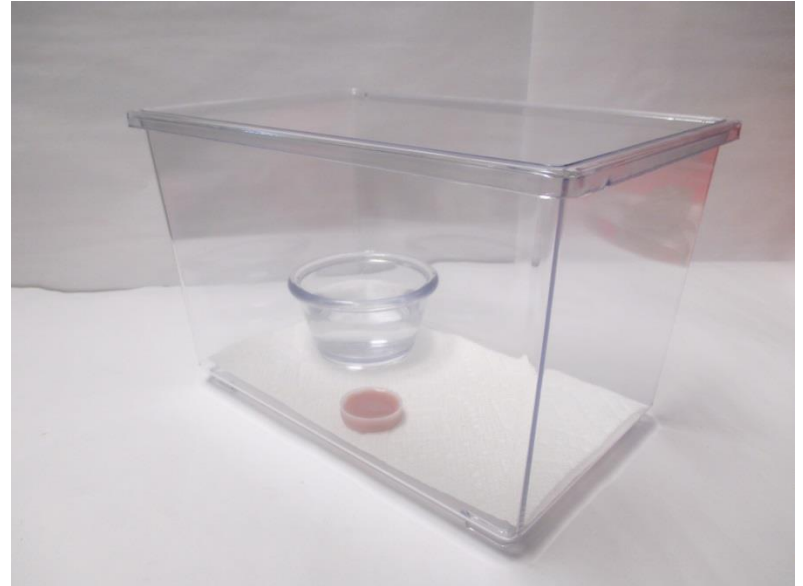
- Start with a clean, well-ventilated cage and remove the lid. Here, we used a plastic critter keeper because it is well ventilated and retains humidity when sprayed with water.

## Step 2



- Add a layer or two of absorbent material. We used two-ply paper towels cut to size. Be careful with loose, naturalistic substrates like cocoa fiber as your hatchling may accidentally ingest it.

# Step 3



- Add a water bowl filled with clean water and food dishes.

## Step 4



- Add some foliage such as silk plants for hiding and climbing. This provides the gecko with enrichment while also helping them feel secure and safe.

# Step 5



- Now, simply place your hatchling into the enclosure and close the lid. Your enclosure is now a gecko home. 😊
