Eligible researchers will have earned their doctoral degrees within the last 15 years, and be full-time, faculty members of an institution in the United States. Applicants must hold a Ph.D. or its equivalent in one of the behavioral and social sciences or in an allied professional field. Three to four fellowships of up to \$150,000 for use over one to three years (and in rare cases, up to five years) will be awarded. The deadline is November 4, 2009.
