Panel Analysis of Intimate Relationships and Family Dynamics

"Pairfam" is a representative panel study for analyzing closed relationships and family relations in Germany. The first wave was conducted in 2008/2009 as a nationwide random sample of 12.000 people which covered three age cohorts in equal groups (15 to 17, 25 to 27, and 35 to 37).
