Health Behavior in School-Aged Children (HBSC) Data

This is a school-based study of health-related attitudes and behaviors of young people and is conducted every four years starting in 1985-1986. The study contains variables dealing with many types of drugs such as tobacco, alcohol, marijuana, inhalants, and any other substances. The study examines the first time these substances were used and the frequency of their use. Other topics include eating habits, body image, health problems, family make-up, personal injuries, bullying, fighting, and bringing weapons to school.
