Helpful Documents for Using the American Community Survey (ACS) Files

The ACS Public Use Microdata Sample (PUMS) files represent a sample of the actual responses to the ACS questionnaire. The 1-year household PUMS data represents approximately 1.3 million housing unit records and the population PUMS data represents about 3 million person records.
