As a child, his home in Germany was burned down by Nazis and his family was deported to a Latvian ghetto via cattle car. He was later separated from his family and spent his teenage years living in concentration camps after his parents and twin brothers were killed. He was finally liberated to Sweden in 1945. A job opportunity brought him to Ohio in 1964, where he married and raised a family. He survived by faith and hope.
