A student should attend all classes until notification of an approved course waiver. If the student would like to waive a course(s) offered in any semester other than the student's first semester, she/he should submit a proposal by November 1st of the year she/he enters the program. The evaluation review committee will meet once during the fall semester to review student materials and instructor recommendations and render a decision. The decision of the evaluation review committee is reviewed by the Director of Clinical Training and communicated to the student.
