

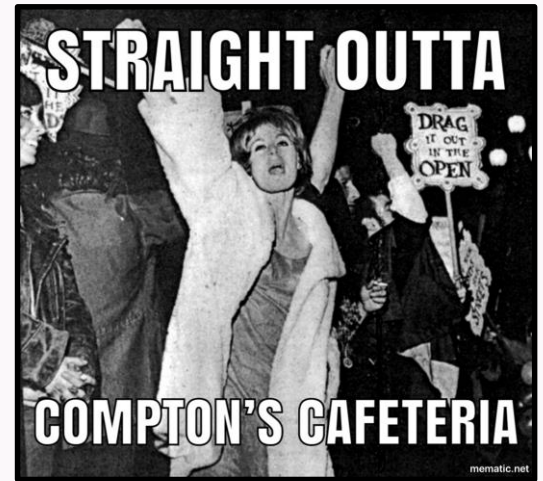

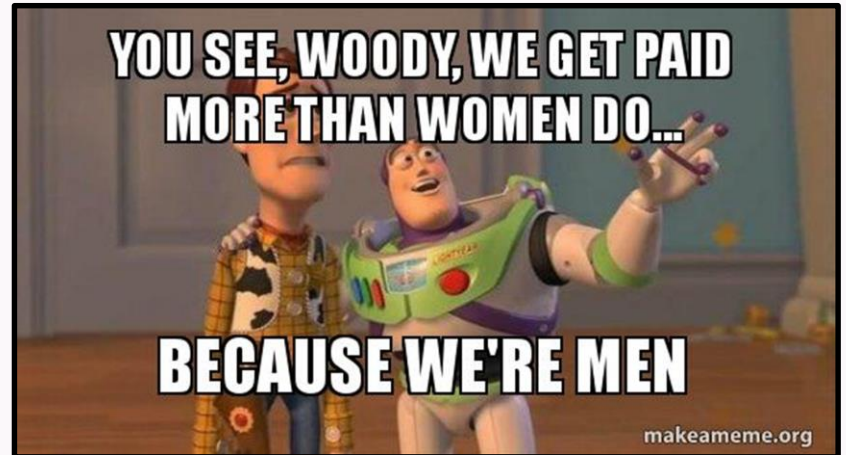
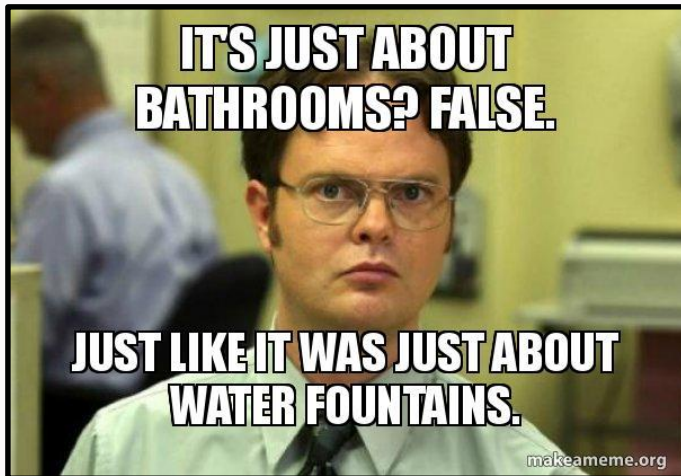
Compton's Cafeteria, in the Tenderloin, San Francisco, was popular with transgender women and drag queens who felt comfortable

there after a night of partying. Compton's had a problem with being a late night hang out and began calling the police to clear the LGBT people out. One night in 1966, the drag queens and transgender women stood up to the police, saying they had a right to eat late like anyone else. The Compton's Cafeteria Riot occurred three years before the riots at the Stonewall Inn in NYC. Some argue it is the true beginning of the LGBT Rights Movement.
