## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The School of Higher Education, Leadership, and Foundations offers a limited number of graduate assistantships to full-time students (enrolled in 9 graduate hours or more per semester for fall and spring) on a competitive basis (application does not guarantee a position). You must be enrolled full time over both fall and spring semesters in the academic year of the GA position. A graduate assistantship provides full-time students with tuition remission and a stipend in exchange for up to 20 hours of work per week for 15 weeks. The appointments are typically made for the academic year, beginning with the fall semester.
- **2.** <u>Duties:</u> Duties vary depending on which department and/or faculty to which you are assigned. Activities most likely include work associated with research, teaching assistant, or administrative.
- **3. Qualifications:** Required skills and dispositions for all positions include:
  - Demonstrate graduate and new professional levels of professionalism
  - Strong work ethic and willingness to be flexible
  - Excellent spoken and written communication skills
  - Willingness to learn and ask questions for clarity
  - Ability to work independently when assigned specific tasks
  - Good time management and organizational skills
  - Computer skills or willingness to learn (e.g., Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Canvas, Prezi, Google sites)
