

NYU Shanghai

Spend your summer in Shanghai, China, a city with over 24 million people where you can truly feel both the traditional culture and vibrancy of an international community. NYU Shanghai, is a 4 year accredited degree granting university that opened its doors in Fall 2013. The student body consist of 300 students; half Chinese from all over China and half international from 46 different countries. Students receive a liberal arts education and select to major in 13 different disciplines. The language of instruction is English, whereas international students will develop near fluency of Mandarin upon graduation. At the core of NYU Shanghai's mission is the notion of multicultural engagement and much of what student affairs does is to support the universities academic mission.

Internship Description:

Students with interests in the following functional areas are encouraged to apply for the internship. You may concentrate on one area or complete projects across many functional areas. (You will work with your supervisor at NYU Shanghai to finalize your work contract; the supervisor will work to match your interests with institution priorities.)

Internship Logistics:

- *Term:* 2 months (June and July, may be negotiated)
- *Hours:* 20-30 per week, depending on negotiated contract
- *Location:* Shanghai, China
- *Language requirement:* None
 - Although English is the main language of NYU Shanghai, Mandarin is the official language of China
- *Number of CSP/HIED interns:* 2 interns (1 CSP student and 1 HIED student preferred)
- *Accommodation:* On-campus residence
 - Students will be placed in a single room in a private or shared apartment. The facilities are equipped with kitchen, laundry, and fully furnished.
- *Meals:* Meal stipend provided
 - A 2000RMB monthly meal stipend will be provided
- *Arrival Logistics:*
 - Arrive at Shanghai Pudong International Airport (PVG)
 - Taxi to the on campus residence is about 45 minutes and more details can be provided once a date of arrival is confirmed.
- *Finances:*
 - *Included:* Accommodation at NYU Shanghai, meal stipend, and opportunities to attend scheduled events as chaperones (covered) or participants (student discounted rate), mobile phone with 200RMB credit monthly.
 - *Not Included:* Round-trip airfare; in-country transportation; personal expenses

NYU SHANGHAI

- *Paid Internship*: No
- *Visa required for U.S. citizens*: Yes
 - You will not be allowed to enter China without a visa. Our mobility office will work with you on the details.
 - A multiple-entry visa is essential if you plan to re-enter China, especially if you plan to visit either Hong Kong or Macau and return to China
 - Visit the U.S. Department of State's (or your home country's) website for updated information
- *Vaccinations*:
 - The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) recommends: routine vaccines (e.g., MMR, diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis) for all travelers; hepatitis A and typhoid for most travelers
 - Contact the Falcon Health Center for updated information (419.372.2271)
- *Money Changing/ATM*: Readily available on campus and throughout the city (almost every corner has an ATM). Best exchange rates will be from the ATM machine. Living in China can be very cheap or can get expensive dependent on your lifestyle. We can answer specific inquiries during the interview process.
