The MFN degree alone does not lead to professional licensure or eligibility for the registered dietitian credentialing examination. Students may wish to combine their graduate studies with an accredited dietetic internship.

BGSU's dietetic internship program is currently accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education of Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (AND). We have an on campus and distance option available.

If you wish to pursue becoming a Registered Dietitian but do not have a F&N/dietetic undergraduate degree, please contact Carrie Hamady, Undergraduate Dietetics Director at carrieh@bgsu.edu to plan your course of study to meet the didactic requirements based on the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics Standards in order to earn a verification statement. This may require one or more years of undergraduate coursework. BGSU currently has an on campus didactic or eCampus didactic program. MFN graduate courses may be used to meet some but not all of the didactic requirements. If you do not have a F&N/dietetic undergraduate degree, completion of the MFN degree alone will not provide you with a verification statement toward a dietetic internship.
