Position Title

Department Chair, Associate or Full Professor, Department of Human Services, College of Health and Human Services, full-time, tenure-track/tenured position starting July 2019.

Primary Responsibilities

- Administratively responsible for all activities of the department and is administratively responsible to the Dean
- Expected to assume an appropriate teaching load in consultation with the Dean (i.e., one class each semester)
- Oversee alumni engagement
- Support a strong research environment in the department
- Maintain CSWE and NAB accreditation requirements for the department
- Manage departmental personnel and budgets. There are 21 full-time faculty within the Department of Human Services and three nonacademic departmental staff.

Minimum Qualifications

- Must hold academic rank at the Associate Professor or higher level and be tenured or eligible for tenure
- Earned Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Social Work, Gerontology, or a closely related discipline
- Current or previous experience as a department Chair
- Track record of successful peer-reviewed scholarly work

Preferred Qualifications (optional)

- Experience with extramurally funded research.
- Earned Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Social Work, Gerontology
- Experience working in an administrative capacity with the academic disciplines represented in the department

Information about Program and College

The department has undergraduate programs in Criminal Justice, Gerontology, and Social Work. The Criminal Justice program is one of the fastest growing programs on campus and currently serves over 500 students. The program offers a BS in Criminal Justice, including a specialization in forensic investigations, a MS in Criminal Justice, with both a face-to-face cohort and an on-line cohort. The Social Work program has a fully accredited BSW program and a new MSW program, with a specialization in gerontological social work. The MSW program is currently in candidacy with the Council of Social Work Education (CSWE). The Gerontology program offers a BS in Gerontology and a Master of Science in Interdisciplinary Gerontology. The Gerontology program also offers an undergraduate and graduate specialization in Long-Term Care (LTC) Administration. Both the undergraduate and graduate LTC Administration degrees are accredited by the National Association of Long-Term Care Administrator Boards (NAB) and are the first Health Services Executive (HSE) programs in Ohio and the United States to be accredited by NAB. Collectively, the undergraduate and graduate degree programs and specializations have a combined enrollment of 1005 students, with an additional 460 minors.
