

Assistant/Associate Professor Bowling Green State University Criminal Justice

Position Description: Bowling Green State University (BGSU) is seeking applicants for a tenure-track position in Criminal Justice at the Assistant or Associate Professor level starting August 2018. The Criminal Justice program is one of the fastest growing programs on campus and currently serves over 500 students. The program offers a BS in Criminal Justice, including a specialization in forensic investigations, a MS in Criminal Justice with both a face-to-face cohort and an on-line cohort, and a graduate specialization in Forensic Investigations in the MS in Forensic Science. The forensic programs are closely tied to the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation's new Crime Lab housed on the campus of BGSU, and the Ohio Attorney General's Center for the Future of Forensic Science. Criminal Justice is one of three programs in the Department of Human Services in the College of Health and Human Services. The successful candidate may have the opportunity to assume a leadership role in the Department.

Primary Responsibilities: Responsibilities include teaching at the graduate and undergraduate level in the criminal justice programs; establishing a record of high quality research and publication; student advising; supervising graduate students; participation in curriculum design; and providing professional service through community engagement and professional societies. Responsibilities also include participation in collaborative and cross-disciplinary teaching, research and service.

Qualifications: Candidates are required to hold a PhD in Criminal Justice/Criminology or closely related field. A Juris Doctorate degree alone does not serve as a qualification for this position. Three years of academic or administrative experience and online teaching experience, are preferred.

Salary: Competitive and commensurate with peer institution levels for rank and position and in keeping with candidate's experience and credentials.

Applicants should submit a letter of application and full curriculum vitae summarizing their suitability for the job, a description of their research plan, a statement of teaching experience/philosophy, contact information and contact information for three professional references. Finalists are also required to furnish official transcripts and are subject to a background check. Application deadline: December 8, 2017.

Bowling Green State University is a residential, comprehensive state supported university with roughly 19,000 undergraduate and graduate students. The city of Bowling Green has a population of just over 30,000 and is located in Northwest Ohio within close proximity of Toledo, Columbus and Cincinnati, Ohio. The Criminal Justice Program at BGSU is housed in the Department of Human Services (with Gerontology and Social Work). The Department employs over 20 faculty and staff members with a strong emphasis on cross-disciplinary teaching and scholarship, as well as service learning. The College of Health and Human Services, with approximately 2300 students, is housed in a newly renovated building with state-of-the-art labs, classrooms and student collaborative spaces.
