Position Description: Bowling Green State University (BGSU) is seeking applicants for a tenure-track position in Social Work at the Assistant or Associate Professor level starting August 2019. The Social Work program is seeking an individual to join our fully accredited BSW program and contribute to the new MSW program, with a specialization in gerontological social work. The MSW is currently in candidacy with CSWE. The successful candidate will have the ability to contribute during an exciting time of growth and opportunities. The curriculum incorporates a commitment to social justice and diversity.

Primary Responsibilities: Responsibilities include teaching at the graduate and undergraduate level in the social work programs; offering courses in practice and other social work content areas; establishing a record of high quality research and publication; student advising; supervising graduate students; participation in curriculum design; and providing professional service through community engagement and professional societies. Responsibilities also include participation in collaborative and cross-disciplinary teaching, research and service.

Qualifications: Candidates are required to hold an MSW degree from an accredited social work program; a doctorate in social work or closely-related field; and post MSW practice experiences. Advanced ABD candidates will be considered but must complete the degree by the end of the first year of employment. The preferred candidates will have experience teaching some combination of social policy, human behavior, and social work practice. Experience in practice with older adults/aging is preferred.

Salary: Competitive and commensurate with peer institution levels for rank and position and in keeping with candidate's experience and credentials.

Application Information: Applicants should submit a letter of application and full curriculum vitae summarizing their suitability for the job, contact information, and contact information for three professional references. Finalists are also required to furnish official transcripts and are subject to a background check. **Application deadline: November 20, 2018.**
