



Locating University Libraries Owned Copies When Using Google Scholar

Google Scholar is available at <http://scholar.google.com/> or via the Libraries' Research Databases web pages at <http://maurice.bgsu.edu/search/y>.

When on campus, Google Scholar will automatically offer you "OhioLINK OLinks" and/or "Find it with OLinks" options with the results of your search. Click on those links to see if the book or journal is owned by the BGSU Libraries, in print or electronically.

When you are off-campus and visit Google Scholar, select "Scholar Preferences" next to the search box. In the "Library Links" section, type "OhioLINK" and click on the "Find Library" button. Select "OhioLINK - Find it with OLinks" in the results and click on "Save Preferences." All subsequent uses of Google Scholar on this particular computer will now offer you the "OhioLINK OLinks" and/or "Find it with OLinks" options with the results of your searches.

RefWorks users can set preferences here also. In the Bibliography Manager section of "Scholar Preferences," select "Show links to import citations into" and choose RefWorks from the dropdown box of choices. Save your preferences. You can now use the "Import to RefWorks" link to add citation information found within Google Scholar directly into your RefWorks account.
