Educators and administrators are invited to engage in collaborative brainstorming sessions focused on the evolving role of artificial intelligence in education.





Did the content from the session increase your interest in AI as it relates to education?




Did the content from the session increase your understanding in AI as it relates to education?

Did you feel your participation in the BGSU Summer AI Cafe was worthwhile?








If future AI professional development is offered by BGSU during the 2025-26 academic year during the school day, are you likely to attend?
