Why AI in Education?

A Microsoft study in May of 2024 shares data and recommendations...

Our schools need to be positioned to fully implement AI Literacy training into all curriculum areas so that all of our students have the opportunities to learn to work with the technology before graduation.

The urgency for training our students is emphasized by the recent Microsoft study in May of 2024 which found:

- ❑ 75% of knowledge workers are now using AI for their work (a 46% increase over in just 6 months)
- ❑ 66% of leaders say they wouldn't hire someone without AI skills
- ❑ 71% say they'd rather hire less experienced candidates with AI skills, than more experienced candidates without them.

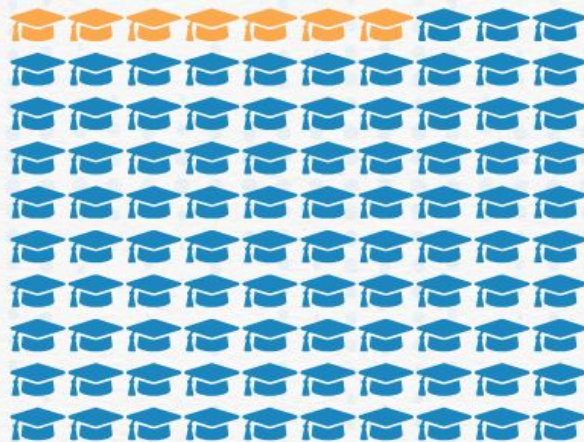

◆ Education Systems Worldwide Lack Guidance on AI

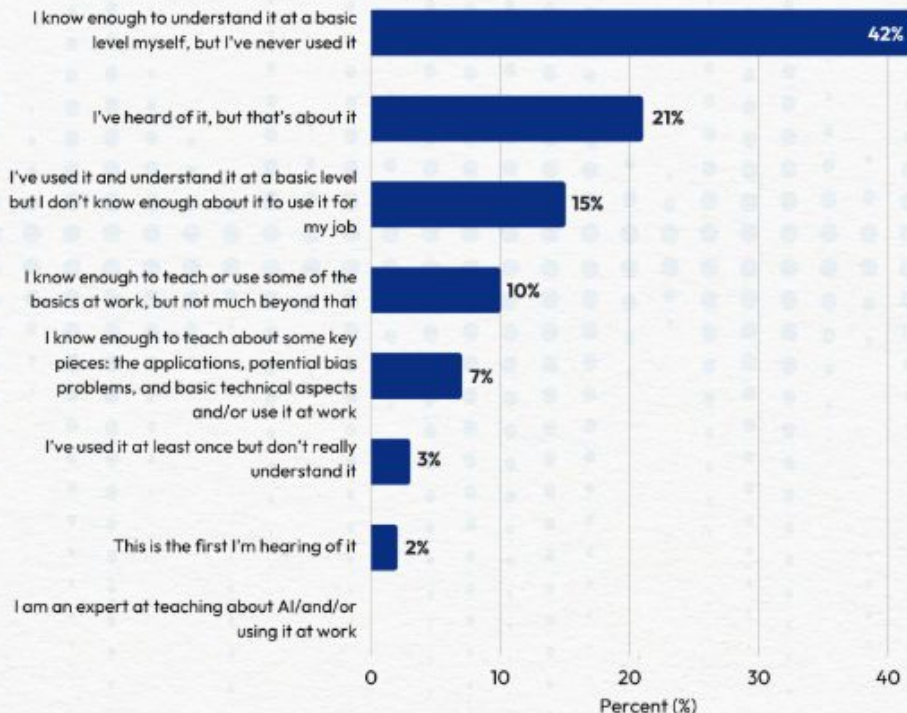
Only 7% of education systems provide guidance about the use of generative AI.

75% have never used AI.

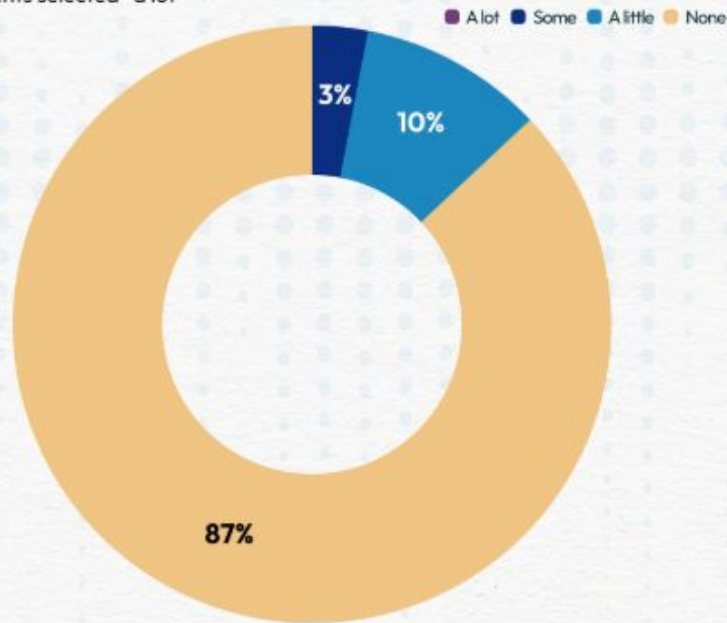
7% use it at work and can teach about applications, bias, and basic technical aspects.

0% of respondents selected "a lot"

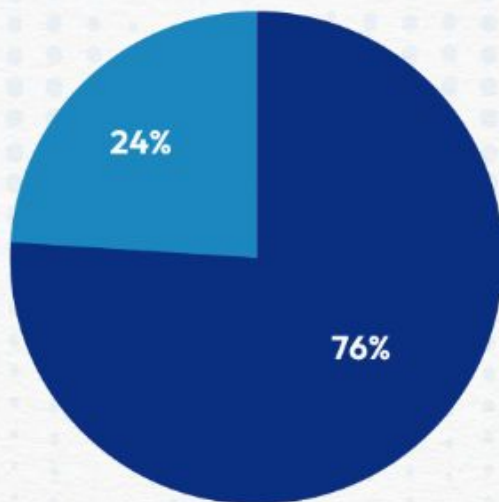


87% have never received any PD about AI.

Teachers AI Use for Work

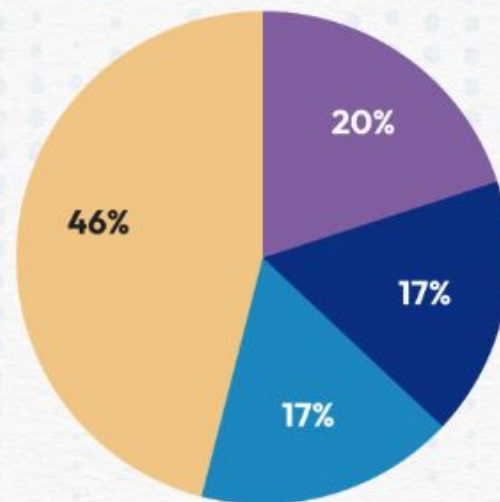
Do teachers use AI for work?
