CALL TO ORDER: By the Vice President

ROLL CALL: By the Secretary (we had a quorum with a total of 13 Executives and 39 Senators in attendance)

APPROVAL OF MINUTES AND AGENDA: CSP Representative moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Biology (MA) Representative.

GUEST SPEAKERS

- Dr. Rodney K. Rogers, BGSU President
 - Appreciate GSS for the opportunity to address the assembly
 - He encouraged us to support each other
 - He applauded the role grad students have played to allow the institutions move forward in the light of the pandemic
 - He also appreciated acknowledged the role Dean Goberman have been playing in the graduate school.
- Questions and Answers
 - Popular Culture Representative: Why did the BGSU change the mask policy in the mid-semester
 - Answer: We chose to follow the science and recommendations of Public health officers and the policy was in line with the CDC recommendations as well as Ohio Department of Health.

- We do follow the proponents of the recommendation and if they change the policy, we will also change it, as we want to be consistent.
- Theater and film (PhD) Representative: In follow up with the previous questions, most of the grad students that teach large number of group were not consulted before deciding on the policy to remove the mask.
- The previous conversations students have has not been effective in the school's policy and how we contribute to the process
- Articulated worries about graduate students not having a strong dialogue and that not following the university policy of public good
- How does the university prove to us that our opinions counts and our voice matters
 - Answer: it is more difficulty to make decisions such as the global pandemic situation
 - We tried to get better
 - However, we reflected on the response of the graduate students
 - He think there were a lot of things they got right and not right, however the university will have to reflect on things they did not get right and adjust

 - During the Summer of 2021 GSS and USGS president's office provided a joint statement in support of an On-Campus pantry
 - GSS supported Student Legal Services by providing a resolution and support of a fee increase to better support student community
 - Awarded over \$35,000 for Funding for Professional Development between the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters,

though we anticipate to go above this amount with Summer funding

- Funded 30 Regalia Awards in support of Graduating Masters and Doctoral Students
- Shanklin Research Colloquium and GSS Awards
 - Over 75 applicants in different categories
 - Partnered with 7 judges
 - 19 finalists awarded over \$10, 000 in recognition of Faculty and Student research excellence
- GSS, SEC and Senators served on 17 different University committees and Graduate students interest were represented on 2 National Search Committees

- GSS welcomed 16 speakers during the academic year of which 10 speakers were welcomed this semester alone
