#### A Bill Formally Requesting a More Holistic Cold Weather Policy

In the Senate of the Undergraduate Student Body here assembled,

- 1 Whereas, the Undergraduate Student Government represents the undergraduate student
- 2 voice at Bowling Green State University; and
- 3 Whereas, Bowling Green State University and the Undergraduate Student Government
- 4 aims to ensure all student voices are represented within our Senate; and
- 5 Whereas, Bowling Green State University's close compliance with state-mandated
- 6 contact hours does not allow enough flexibility for classes to be canceled; and
- 7 Whereas, BGSU is not considering student health as the sole factor for canceling classes;
- 8 and
- 9 Whereas, Exposure to extreme temperatures can cause health issues like frostbite in
- 10 under 30 minutes\*\*; and
- 11 Whereas, Canceling classes would allow BGSU students to stay inside and not put their
- health at risk by walking around campus to get to class and commuter students to not
- 13 have to drive to campus on potentially unsafe roads; and
- 14 **Whereas,** International students and out-of-state students might come from warmer
- 15 climates and not be as well-adjusted to freezing and negative temperatures and could
- 16 understandably not be equipped with the knowledge of proper safety in cold weather
- 17 conditions; and
- 18 Whereas, Some students will not have access to proper physical supplies due to financial
- 19 hardship or lack of information on what supplies are necessary; and
- 20 Whereas, BGSU does not provide adequate resources and physical supplies (hats, gloves)
- 21 to those who need them, leaving students at risk; and
- 22 Whereas, Students might feel pressured to go to class even if it is unsafe to commute
- 23 because of attendance policies; and
- 24 Whereas, The health and safety of all BGSU students is a top priority for USG; and

25	<b>Therefore, let it be resolved that,</b> The Undergraduate Student Government asks the
26	University to write a calendar that allows there to potentially be multiple snow days in a
27	semester without violating the Department of Education's policy on contact hours; and
28	Let it be further resolved, That the Undergraduate Student Government asks the
29	University to provide more resources on how to safely navigate extreme temperatures,
30	before the cold weather is affecting them, and provide physical materials, such as hats,
31	scarves, and winter coats, for students to adjust to cold weather and be able to safely
32	commute to classes; and
33	Let it be further resolved, That the Undergraduate Student Government asks the
34	University to notify students of winter weather closure at least three hours before the class
35	time it is cancelling because students need time to alter their plans; and
36	Let it be further resolved, That the Undergraduate Student Government asks the
37	University to put out a policy on extracurricular activities and student employment when
38	classes are cancelled to alleviate any misunderstandings; and
39	Let it be further resolved, That the Undergraduate Student Government asks the
40	University to encourage professors to communicate individual cancellation policies to
41	students in a timely manner, including if class will still be held; and
42	Let it finally be resolved, That the Undergraduate Student Government asks the University
43	to empower students to not attend class if there is a danger for them to commute to class
44	and further encourage professors to not penalize students who choose not to attend class
45	during extreme weather events.
