 - a. Dr. Nick Hennessy Sustainability Coordinator, BGSU
 - My title is Sustainability Coordinator. I am a one-person office. What you see
 here is a result of a lot of volunteer effort. Two paid internships, also students
 working for academic credit.

 - 2. Nearly everything we do at the university center around 3 things: reduce, reuse, recycle.
 - 3. Areas of focus: These are the areas that we are heavily involved in. All of them are part of the sustainability effort.
 - 4. At first, we were doing a lot of independent projects. We needed a comprehensive plan, attack everything from a sustainability standpoint.
 - a. We came up with a three point plan.
 - 5. Results of the survey will be reported on December 11th.
 - 6. Had a higher number of student volunteers; over 30 volunteers per home game.
 - 7. Recycling is not in the Sustainability profile.
 - 8. I cannot overestimate the value of you expressing what you think.

 - 1. Senator Timbrook- Concerning the LEAD buildings, what kind of features do they have?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy- It starts with their construction. The materials that are incorporated into the building, how much is recycled on-site

- during the process, native materials versus importing. Energy efficiency is huge, how much energy does it use.
- 2. Chair Durkit- After a building has been slated as "Silver", is there any room for advancement?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy-No. There is a window of opportunity, but after that, the plaque's screwed into the wall. In the situation of the Oaks, there was a preliminary determination of the points, and they wanted a re-evaluation.
- 3. Chair Puccio- Is there a plan to use solar energy?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy-I wouldn't call it a plan. It amounts to a discussion. Started talking about a solar array that would be large in size. Meeting with AMPOhio. Anything in our district has to go through the City of Bowling Green. We can't go off and produce our own electricity, need to put some on the grid. Talking about it, very much in the talking stages. 3,000 student Baptist college ahs the largest solar array of all of ohio. What it is now is hopeful talk. Need it between 3-5 megawatts.
- 4. Chair Puccio- How much money would that save the University?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy-Depends on the deal worked out with the other parties. Typically, you partner with a company who builds the array, we lease them the land. Need to buy the solar energy from them. What we negotiate in \$/kw/hr.
- 5. Chair Juzkiw- Green fund discussion went in the direction of green Learning Community. Your thoughts?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy-Would be great. Very supportive of that. Need to determine what the money would go towards. Eco leaders, green RA's. Look at the example of Denison. Large alumni donation.
 A lot of cool programming, big impact on the university.
- 6. Chair Durkit- Was the office of Sustainability involved in the gas leak crisis?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy-No, not whatsoever. That project is the BCI building. Just sits on University land.
- 7. Senator Dettrow- There were a few solar panels on the ice arena. Those are dedicated to the Ice Arena?
 - a. Dr. Hennessy-Yes. Three panels, one not-operational. Go directly to the lighting and cooling of ice arena. Partnership with the City.
- 8. Senator Dudek- How do you make a dysfunctional panel work?

- a. Dr. Hennessy-The panels literally break. Thin-film technology.
 Back in the day, panels were fragile. Weather, and age. Not angled, flat.
